A Key Driver of Prosperity and Employment for Ontario

- Toronto Pearson is a massive economic enabler that drives prosperity and supports small businesses and jobs:
 - Total volume of revenue generated is \$26.4 billion
 - Total employment income is \$6.8 billion
- The anchor organization of the largest employment area in Ontario:
 - 38,000 employees work at Toronto Pearson (direct jobs)
 - 185,000 indirect jobs supported by the airport, many of these are small businesses



A Key Tourism Enabler

Overseas arrivals, January to November 2011:

- Ontario: +6.2%

- Rest of Canada: -1.7%

- Ontario market share of overseas arrivals: 39.6%

Overseas visitor spending, 2009 to 2010: + 19%

Goods and Services Purchased

- In 2011, \$555 million worth of goods and services were purchased by Toronto Pearson
 - 70% from the Greater Toronto Area, through a 'Buy Local' commitment and policy







Best Practices - Zürich Airport

- The influence of regional planning
- Correlation between spatial distribution and economic effects
