2023-03-21 or 2023-03-22

During the night of March 21-22 between approx. 11:30pm and 2:00am, NAV Canada will be conducting flight checks to test the Instrument Landing systems (ILS) of runways 06L, 06R, and 15L. While these checks are underway, residents may notice low-flying patterns.

What are Flight Checks and why do they need to happen?

An ILS is a precision approach system that provides navigational guidance signals and information on a cockpit display to guide pilots accurately to the point of landing in periods of reduced visibility. This information is especially necessary in inclement weather with low ceilings, snow, fog or rain, when pilots have poor visibility. The ILS data transmitted to the cockpit provides lateral and vertical guidance.

Flight checks occur, at a minimum, twice every year for each runway end. Historically these checks have happened during the daytime, but they are now occurring at night to reduce the overall impact to regular runway operations at Toronto Pearson Airport.
